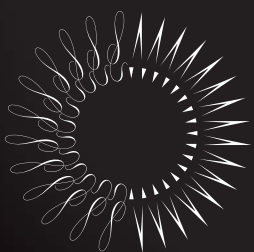

A playful two-year-old, Kyle Allgood of Chubbuck, Idaho, fell ill after consuming bagged spinach contaminated by a deadly strain of *E. coli*. When his abdominal agony would not subside, he was flown to a Salt Lake City hospital, where his downward spiral ended in kidney failure, a heart attack and death.

And Kyle's case is far from unique. Each year, tens of millions of Americans get sick from eating contaminated food. Hundreds of thousands are hospitalized, and thousands die.*

Our national food-safety laws, originally passed in 1906, are woefully out of date. We need a new, modern system that greatly reduces the chances of contamination and catches any outbreak before it can claim more victims like Kyle.
