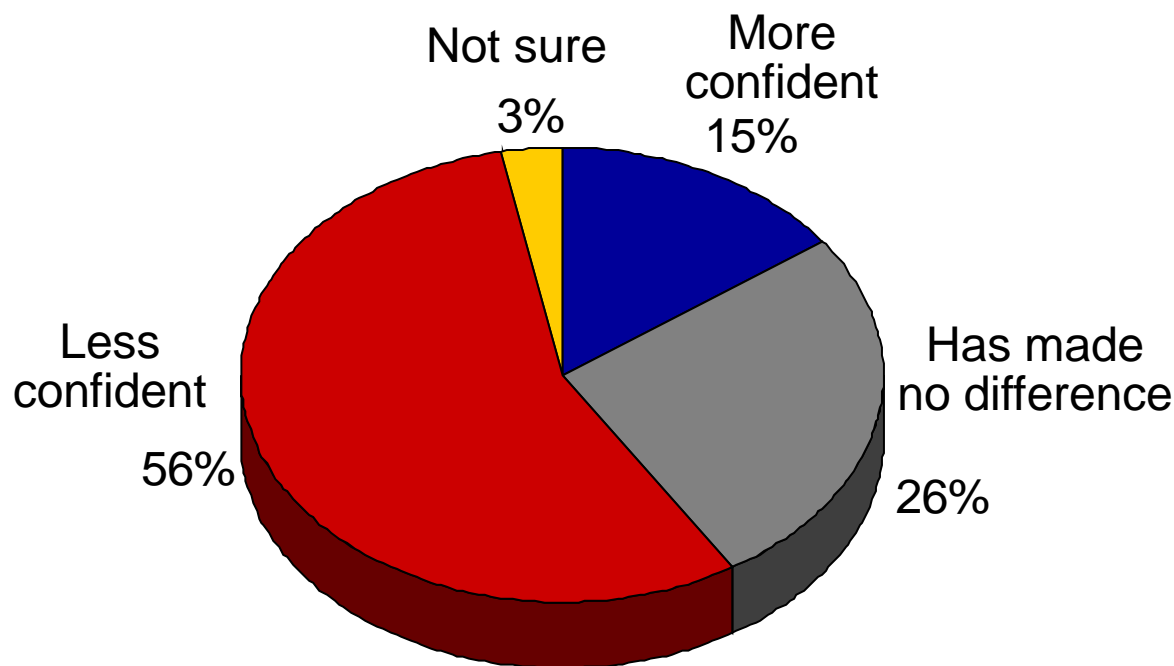

Voters Have Lost Confidence In Safety Of Food

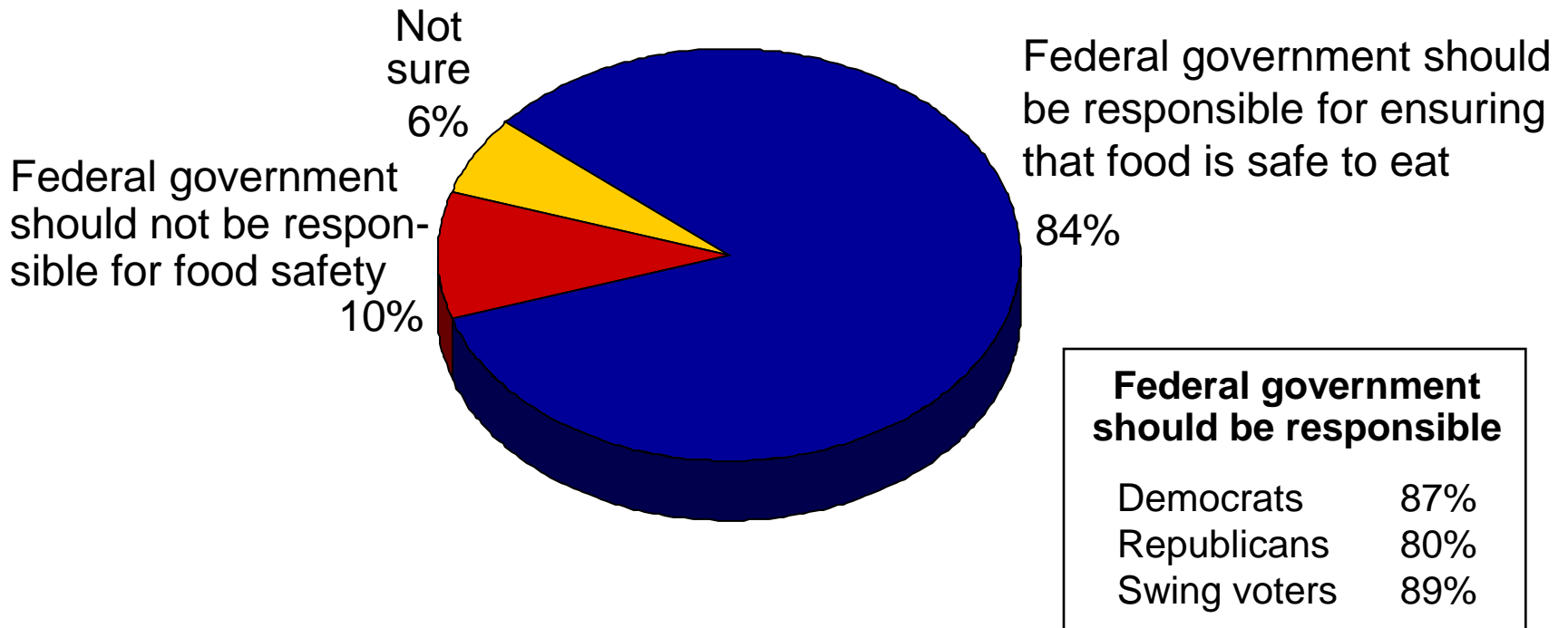
Has what you have seen and heard in the news over the past year or so made you more confident or less confident in the safety of food that is sold here in the United States?*



* Question intro: "When I talk about food safety, I mean food that is safe to eat and free of any contamination by bacteria that make people sick."

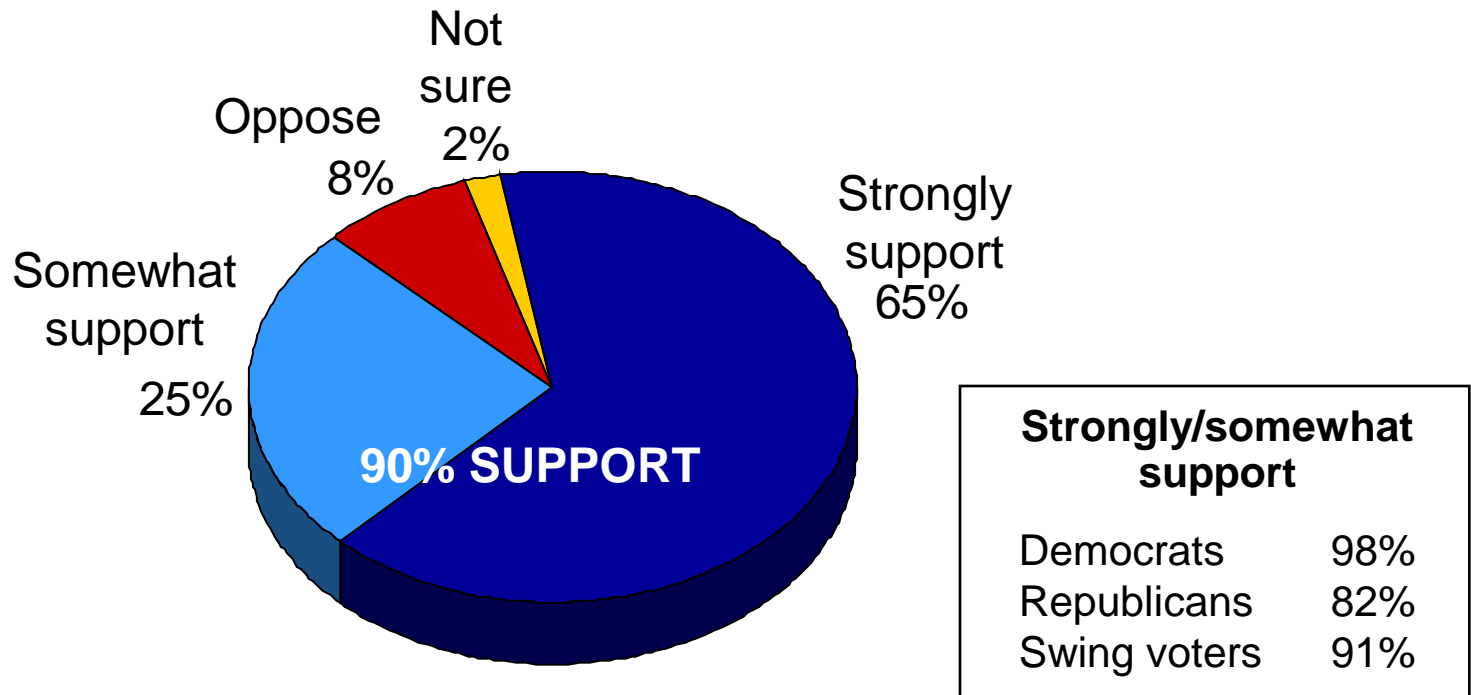
Most See Role For Federal Government

Preferred Federal Government Role in Food Safety

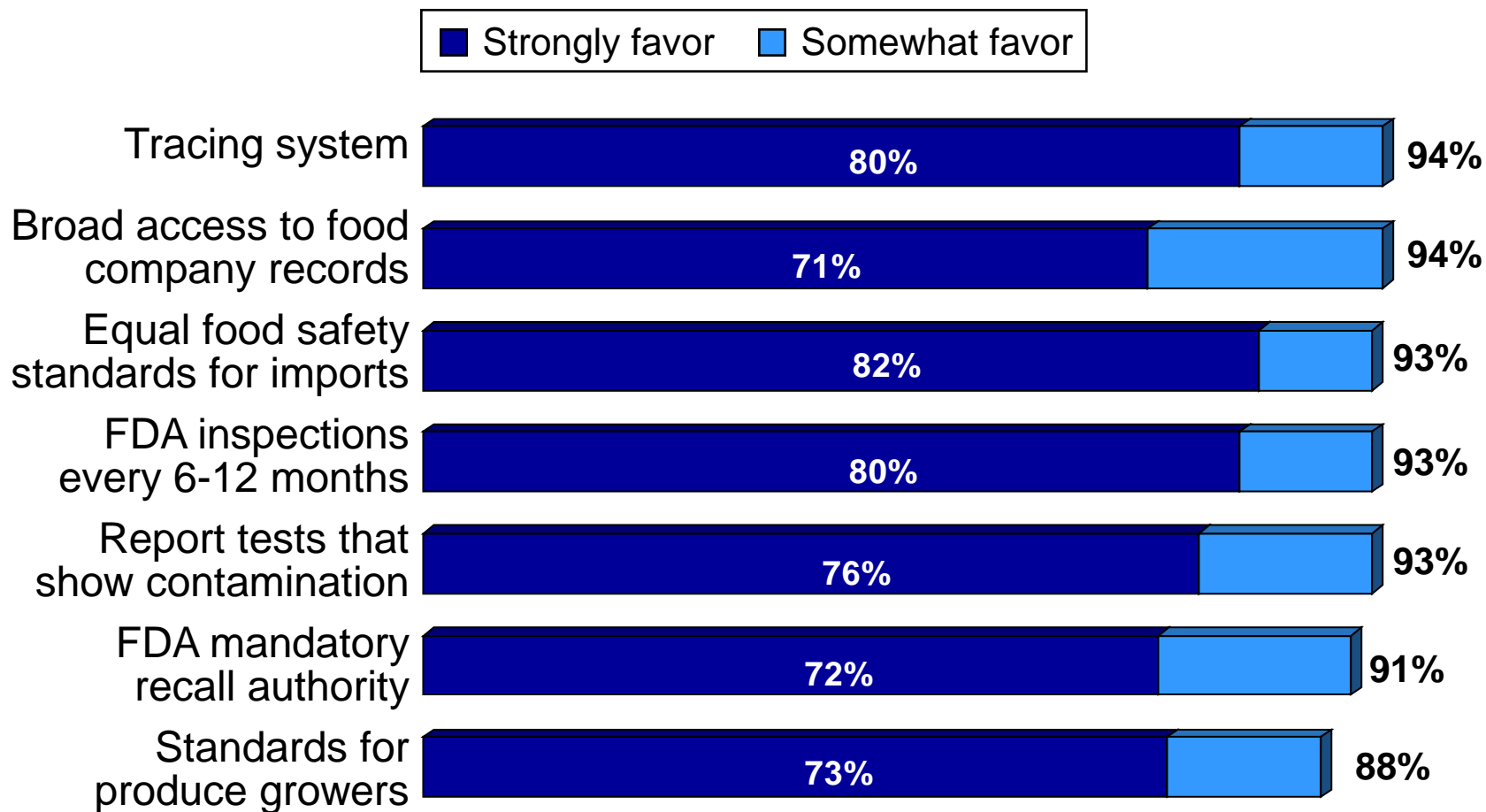


Wide Support For New Safety Measures
